### **Food Lion Feeds Hunger Relief Day to Be Held at N.C. State Fair Oct. 18**

*5 Cans of Food Lion Food = Free Admission*

**RALEIGH, NC** – For the 15th consecutive year, on **Thursday, October 18, as part of Food Lion Feeds Hunger Relief Day**, those attending the N.C. State Fair will have the opportunity to receive free admission into the fair with a donation of five cans of Food Lion brand items to benefit the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina (the Food Bank) and its sister food banks around the state.

Since 1993, approximately 4.8 pounds of food has been collected at the N.C. State Fair. Food Lion Feeds Hunger Relief Day is part of the grocer's commitment to provide 500 million meals to individuals and families in need by the end of 2020.

In the wake of Hurricanes Florence and Michael, Food Lion Feeds Hunger Relief Day is especially important. Thousands in southeastern North Carolina were without power and are still dealing with the effects of flooding and storm damage. During the relief and recovery from a natural disaster, the need for emergency food increases as displaced families seek precious resources. Food & fund donations help the Food Bank provide emergency and increased assistance to Food Bank partner agencies.

More than 400 volunteers work each gate at the fair to collect donations throughout the day. Last year fairgoers donated approximately 180,000 meals (equal to a little over 200,000 pounds of food). The goal for this year's Food Lion Feeds Hunger Relief Day is to cross that 5 million pound mark of food donated for people in need.

Based in Raleigh, the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina serves 34 counties in the central and eastern part of the state through six warehouses in Durham, Greenville, New Bern, Raleigh, Southern Pines and Wilmington and is one of seven Feeding America food banks in the state.

The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina is a nonprofit organization that has provided food for people at risk of hunger in 34 counties in central and eastern North Carolina for more than 35 years. The Food Bank serves a network of more than 800 partner agencies such as soup kitchens, food pantries, shelters, and programs for children and adults through warehouses in Durham, Greenville, New Bern, Raleigh, the Sandhills (Southern Pines), and Wilmington. In fiscal year 2017-2018, the Food Bank distributed nearly 70 million pounds of food (over half of which was perishable) and non-food essentials through these agencies. Sadly, hunger remains a serious problem in central and eastern North Carolina.
