Kids Summer Stock Campaign Launches June 2

Stock Food Bank shelves when cafeterias close

WILMINGTON – The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina kicks off summer on June 2, 2011 with its annual food and funds drive Kids Summer Stock. This campaign serves to raise food, funds and awareness in our four county service area at a time when food drive donations tend to slow down and school cafeterias close to more than 30,000 children on the free and reduced meal program. Children served by our Wilmington branch in Brunswick, Columbus, New Hanover and Pender Counties are still in need of meals when school is out.

During the summertime, community-based non-profit agencies such as food pantries and children's programs supported by the Food Bank report an increase in the number of parents and grandparents seeking food assistance for their families.

This awareness-building food and funds campaign has been extremely successful and has provided more than 4 million meals to children and their families since the summer of 2008.

The community can support Kids Summer Stock in the following ways:

- Donate money For every dollar donated, the Food Bank can generally provide eight dollars (\$8) worth of food or approximately four meals. Log on to www.foodbankcenc.org or text 40meals to 50555 to make an instant \$10 donation.
- Donate food Hold a food drive in your community this summer.
- Donate time Spread the word via Social Media i.e. Twitter, Facebook and Blogs.
- Attend our Social Media Mixer on June 2 at Zoes Kitchen in Mayfaire from 6pm-8pm. Bring non-perishable food items to be entered for prizes. Zoes Kitchen will also donate 15% of sales to the Food Bank between 4pm-9pm.

Support the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina in keeping our shelves full so that children and their families will continue to access meals through our partner agencies.

The Food Bank serves a network of more than 800 partner agencies such as soup kitchens, food pantries, shelters, and programs for children and adults through warehouses in Durham, Greenville, New Bern, Raleigh, the Sandhills (Southern Pines) and Wilmington. In fiscal year 2009-2010, the Food Bank distributed more than 41.5 million pounds of food and non-food essentials through these agencies.
