



1,000 Volunteers in RTP Pack More Than 150,000 Meals for Hunger Action Month, Day of Service

Research Triangle Park, N.C. (Sept. 11, 2014) – The Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina has joined with **14 Triangle-area companies** to feed those living with hunger. More than **1,000 RTP professionals** ditched the office to unite for the third annual Sort-A-Rama, far exceeding the **150,000 meals** goal by packaging **176,000 meals** for families at risk of hunger. The event, “Sort-A-Rama,” is the Food Bank’s largest one-day volunteer project and serves to highlight Hunger Action Month, a national initiative for food banks around the country for advocacy, awareness and engagement. Sort-A-Rama is also held in recognition of 9/11 and the National Day of Service and Remembrance.

Presenting partners *BASF, Blue Cross and Blue Shield of North Carolina (BCBSNC), Cisco* and *Food Lion* led the half-day effort to bring 1,000 corporate volunteers together from *Duke Energy, Extreme Networks, Informatica, NetApp, PPD, Research Triangle Foundation, RTI International, SunTrust, Wells Fargo* and *Woodforest Bank*. Volunteers sorted **210,000 pounds** of bulk-sized bins of pasta, beans and rice into family-sized portions during Sort-A-Rama 2014.

Attendance for the event in 2014 has more than doubled since its inaugural event in 2012, which hosted 400 volunteers and provided 80,000 meals for families and children across the Food Bank’s 34-county service area. Over 100,000 meals were provided to the community in 2013 with the help of 700 Sort-A-Rama volunteers.

Mark Calaway, the “voice” of the Carolina RailHawks, served as the honorary “coach” to rally the volunteers toward their goal of sorting and packing more than 150,000 meals in one day. A moment of silence was held to remember those lost on 9/11.

Governor Pat McCrory, along with executives from BASF, BCBSNC, Cisco and Food Lion issued the first “ceremonial” scoops.

"We are dedicated to helping provide food to the community, especially those in need," said **Nevin McDougall, senior vice president of BASF Crop Protection North America.** "Our team works with farmers to help them meet their challenges and get the most out of every acre so that there is enough food for our community members."

"For North Carolinians who are already worried about when their next meal will be, it can be even more challenging to ensure that the foods they are eating are wholesome and nutritious," said **Jo Abernathy, BCBSNC chief information officer** and Food Bank volunteer. "Through Sort-A-Rama and other programs, BCBSNC is committed to increasing access to healthy foods in order to make a lasting impact on the health of our communities across the state."

"Cisco focuses on connecting the unconnected and supporting critical human needs for those in our community. Food insecurity in North Carolina is a serious and growing concern," said **Jeff Zirker, senior director of Global Technical Services.** "Cisco employees have volunteered over 2,700 hours this past year with the Food Bank. We are honored to continue our support today with 175 Cisco executives and employee volunteers."

"We are honored to partner with the Food Bank of Central & Eastern N.C., for the second consecutive year to eliminate hunger in the Raleigh area through the Sort-A-Rama community event," said **Mike Hall, director of operations for the Raleigh market, Food Lion.** "At Food Lion, we believe no one should have to choose between dinner and paying rent or gasoline and buying groceries. That's why we're so passionate about our renewed focus of ending hunger and working to make the lines shorter at local feeding agencies through our Food Lion Feeds community platform. Last year, we helped provide 100,000 meals for local hungry families. On Sept. 11, 175 Raleigh-area Food Lion associates joined other local volunteers to pack 150,000 meals to help feed local families."

September is Hunger Action Month across the country for Feeding America Food Banks. The 150,000 packaged meals will be immediately available for distribution through the Food Bank's network of more than 800 partner agencies which include food pantries, rescue missions and soup kitchens across the Food Bank's 34-county service area.
